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Groups in Context a) The location of resources can affect employment, due to the affects it will have on the groups studied. It is important for each group in socioty to have access to resources, which will ultimately assist them in gaining employment. Access to resources such as; TAFE, school and University, are is needed by the specific groups studied to increase their chances of gaining full time employment. If the location of these much needed facilities and resources is not accessable, then it will affect employment and the chances of people with specificneeds gaining employment. Education and training facilities, Job agencies, centrelink and other resources that assist people in gaining employment, need to be located in areas that will be



easily accessed by the 11 groups in context. Employment is a special need of these groups and if the location of training 2 Employment facilities are not accessable, then their chanches of gaining employment and very limited.

6) Sole Parents are people who are single with one or more children. There Sole parents have many specific needs and require recognition within the community. · Health needs for sole parents will vary in accordance with the individual. Sole pavents are full time carers for their child/ children, and therefore are required to provide for the healthneeds of themselves and their children. They may require physical health support and services, or emotional and psychological health services depending on their situation and needs.



FINANGAL SUPPORT Sole pavents are at greater risk of poverty than any other family type. This is due to the fact that they are on a single income and are required to financially support themselves and their children. A large majority of sole parents recieve a persion or other governtment benefit, which assists them in providing for basic physical needs. Working or returning to work may be an option for sole parents, but they need to consider the added Lost of childrare and decide weather or not they would be better off financially in the paid workforce. Centrelink provides sole parents pension, family allowance and subsidised childrare to all unemployed sole parents. Sole parents need for Anancial support will vary, but due to the sole income, it is often for them to meet all financial needs on their own.



SENSE OF IDENTITY

H is important for sole parents to meet social, psychological and physical needs of their family. Due to financial restrictions, and it may be hard for the sole parent to be able to attend social functions. They are solely responsible for their children and therefore may not go out very often. As sole parents devote themselves to their children they may experience psychological hardship in maintaining their own sense of Identity. By not participating in social events, they may start to lose their seven sense of Identity which will event effect their feelings of self worth and self esteem.

Sole parents are a group in socioty who "<sup>often</sup> experience hardship in the many area's of their life. Support services, such as centrelink and health centres, will act as my significant influences and



assistance which ultimately is striving to help sole parents in meeting their specific needs.

c) Youth and Older people are groups in socioty which often eperience equity issues. The government has introduced various strategies to assist youth and older people in dealing with equity Issues. Youth may be defined as people Around 12 to 25 yrs old. As a group in Society whom are young, they face various equity issues in areas such as: employment, acceptance & recognition, sociotal contributions, and awards and restrictions. Each issue contributes to the self esteem of youth, which is their greatest need as There is now a 'rising alarm' over youth suicide. Employment is a issue of concern for many school-leavers and even

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those who are still studying. Award wages and regulations have been introduced to ensure that all youth are treated equaly and appropriately within their work place. It is extremly important for youth to feel accepted and needed. Acceptance contributes to young peoples sense of Idendity and self esteem. Governments initiate awareness seminars and other supports for youth in the area of alcoptance, but no official management strategies have been presented. The Government has released a Youth Affairs Policy statement which recognises youth as our future leaders. The statement discusses various strategies in the areas of: education, employment, legal durinking and driving ages, awareness of Importantance of youth and Policies to be activated which will assist young people. The strategies outlined



in the statement evaluate equity Issues and what strategies will be implemented to ensure that all youth are treated with equality. Youth are often rewed by socioty as "dilinguents" or troable makers, but it is extremly important for youth to feel needed, accepted and appreciated in many aspects and areas of life. The Government is striving to influence equity and to eliminate unfair treatment to groups in socioty. Older people are those people who are 65+ years of age. It is common for older people to feel under-valued and unappreciated within a community Dasa Age discrimination is a common occurance within socioty. Many view the aged as old, frail, and useless, labelling them such names as 'hags'



'old codgers' and the list goes on. Older people also experience equity issues in the area of security and safety. They are offen viewed as fraith and are alles therfore subject to abuse, physically and mentally. It is not common for age older people to be engaged in full time employment, and they it is due to this that they also face financial in readship. The Covernment has produced various management strategies to assist the aged in achieving equity and equality within the community The Government has revealed an \* Aged care Housing Policy \* an #Age Discrimination Legislation and The Aged Care Act, which all focus on equity issues in relation to older people. 1999 was the International Year of the Older person, which



Influenced the development of appreciation of older people. Older people vere recognised for their contributions to Socioty, and especially their volunteer uork. The strategies which have been developed to address the equity issues faced by the Aged, have effectively assisted in the development of a recognition of older people's contributions to socioty. Equity Issues still exist with communities, but the policies and stratiges which that have been introduced have influenced the extent to which equity Issues develop. The sged and Youth are two large groups in socioty, each contrasting but containing various similar tier. Equity Issuer will always prevail in these groups, but the Government is striving to climinate them the extent to which they prevail.
