a) ~~The~~ Location of resources can be seen to have great impact on the gaining of employment. Training, education and skills are all necessary when an individual seeks employment and is also necessary for ongoing achievement in employment, thus, making the probability of an individual gaining employment decrease without access to such resources. Transportation allows travelling to and from work easy, but if an individual is distanced from these, it can make it difficult. Characteristics of the homeless include malnutrition, lack of shelter and a nurturing environment and may have become homeless as a result of a decline in mental, physical & health, income or a variety of other reasons. In assessing the effectiveness of government policies, The Home and Community Care program of 1986 by the Commonwealth government is of extreme importance. This program meant that maintenance to housing and support was given to elderly members of the community meaning they could remain living at home thus promoting a quality of life and independence. Social interaction is extremely important part of the elderly individuals lives. However this often becomes an issue of concern when the persons health has deteriorated to the point where the government or family

Australian society has never been a society viewed to value the aged meaning the individual does not gain the opportunity to perform social roles and is often left in nursing homes, secluded and feeling they are a burden.

The assumption that the elderly can be defined by age and not individual differences means a not very sensitive approach is achieved.
