Question 11 (2 marks)

Identify a special need that a chronically ill person might have, and explain how it can be met.

Explain ONE ethical guideline/procedure you would follow when conducting qualitative research involving people who are chronically ill.

Question 13 (3 marks)

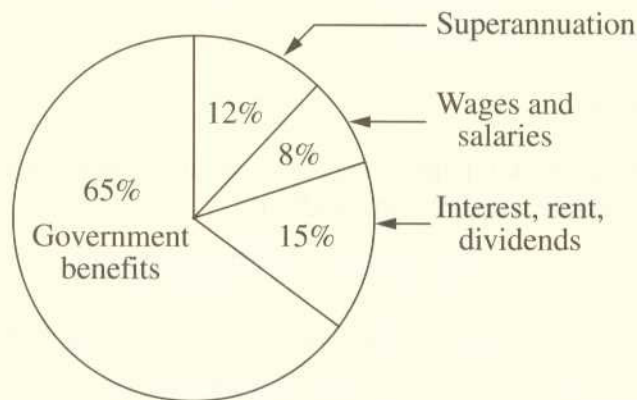
Outline the sequence of steps to be followed when conducting a research project.

Question 14 (4 marks)

Researchers have conducted a study in their local community to investigate the sources of income of aged people.

The results are shown in the graph.



Sources of income of aged people

Account for the data in the graph.

65% of the aged community receive government benefits.
15% have interest, rent and dividends
12% have a superannuation fund
Whereas only 8% have wages and salaries.

Question 15 (4 marks)

Describe TWO strategies that parents can use to manage multiple-role expectations arising from work and family commitments.

Parents can manage multiple-role expectations by using the process called the management process. First the parents have to plan out each day for a week, the parents then have to organise this plan to fit everything in and keep the family happy, the plan then gets implemented into the schedule then after one or two weeks of this plan being put into action the parent sits down to evaluate how well the plan is working.
