**Question 13** (3 marks)

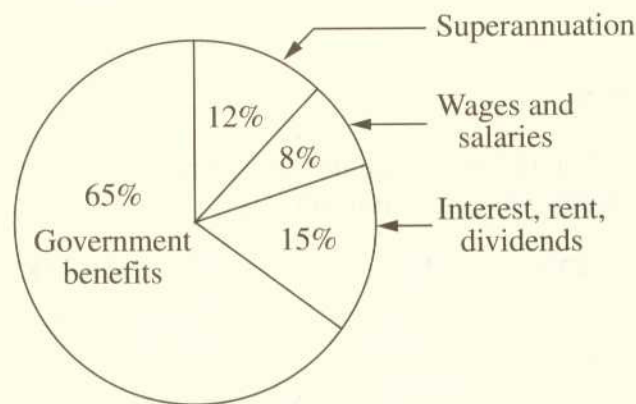
Outline the sequence of steps to be followed when conducting a research project.

The results are shown in the graph.



Sources of income of aged people

Account for the data in the graph.

12% of income comes from superannuation which is a percentage of money which was once taken out of their pay and when retired can be taken out of account. 65% Government benefits, includes, health benefits, concessions for buses and trains, sometimes even cinemas/movies. Interest, rent, dividends, money to put towards or cover all rent of home, & wages and salaries. Wages may include retirement money owed by employer.
