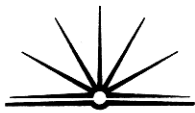


TEXT ONE

- (a) (i) One ^{mentioned} change in the song lyric is the change from a place where trees are found to a place where there is a parking lot. This is an environmental change.
- (ii) The two techniques used to convey this negative environmental change ~~is~~ and hence the ideas in the song ~~is~~ are repetition and visual imagery. By constantly repeating "They paved paradise / And put up a parking lot" the author's view is presented ^{and emphasized} showing ~~that~~ ironically, ^{that} a parking lot is paradise, when it clearly isn't. The other technique is the use of visual imagery, by directly contrasting a "parking lot with a pink hotel..." to "Spots on my apples", you can see that a specific environmental change has taken

By using this vivid imagery she is able to show a natural change. She also communicates a natural change through the use of personal language - "you" and "our". By constantly using "you" throughout the poem she personalizes the change the cicada is going through, thus a natural change is emphasized and communicated.

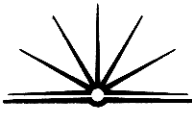
