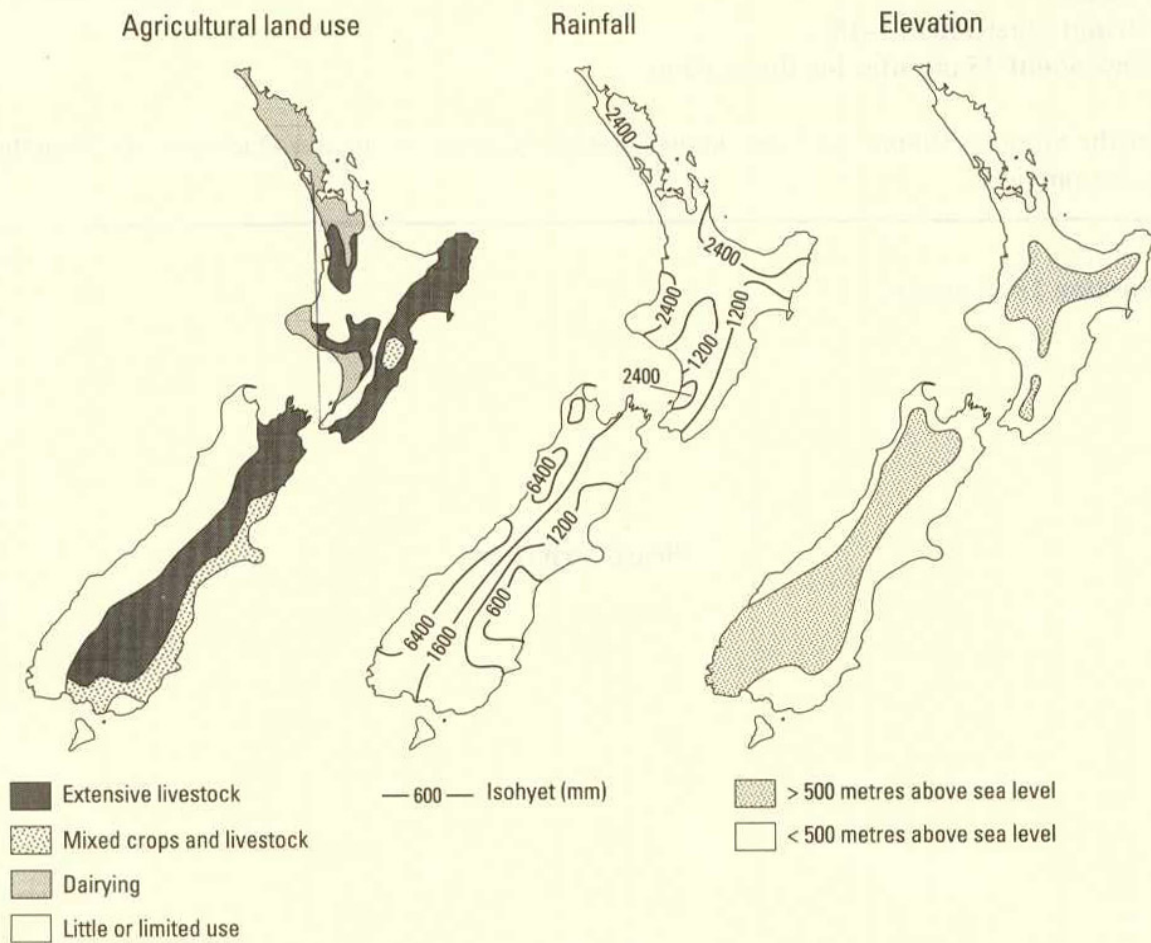

- (b) Account for the distribution of agricultural land use in the South Island of New Zealand. 4

Most farming, livestock and crops are produced on the east coast. They are situated there because of the high elevation of the mountains separating the island is inhospitable to farming. Harsh conditions, wind and rain ~~low~~-effect the ~~east~~ ^{west} coast blown in from the Tasman Sea. Livestock that is in the mountains is usually specially bred such as goats, deer and certain breeds of sheep. The flat land of the Canterbury plains holds most of the crop farming.
