This occurrence in Christchurch of the 'white flight' would be were the wealthy move out and this makes 'urban villages' within the city. 'Urban villages' is where gangs, crews and street gangs move in, there are the cultural people coming in for employment and cheap housing such as the informal sector, business of homelessness people.

Urban dynamics can be evident in all different parts of the developed world and again these urban places all have there own characteristics within them.
