The failure of Democracy in Germany, including the Weimar period was said to have been due to ~~the~~ five Democratic Flaws. Including Lack of democratic tradition, Flaws in the Constitution, Strong Opponents, Psychological aspects.

The lack of Democratic tradition in Weimar Germany, Germany between the end of WWI in 1918 and 1934, made it difficult for those holding the power in Germany to get used to and understand the structure and running of a Democracy.

Constitutional Flaws, such as article 42, allowing the head of state to rule by decree, not the reichstag, these were meant to be emergency powers but made it possible for ~~them~~^{it} to be used as a means of manipulating the government system.
