

Charles Perkins was a prominent speaker in Aboriginal rights. ~~The~~ ^{His} social class, ethnicity ~~affectedly~~ affected his power and authority.

Charles Perkins had power to influence others when he was a speaker in the 1965 'freedom rides' through the outback of ~~the~~ New South Wales.

He took 30 university students with him to tell the people of ~~the~~ Country New South Wales about the injustices the Aboriginals were facing.

He had authority when he was ~~the~~ the Secretary of a government chamber in 1984, which was the highest position, ~~ever held by~~ ~~as~~ as a public servant ever held by an Aboriginal ~~at~~ person he was also ~~at~~ elected on the ATSIC board.

Some people didn't respond to Charles because he was Aboriginal.

Charles was born ~~at~~ ^{on} the back steps of a hospital because Aborigines were not allowed inside hospitals which means that had to endure social inequality. As well as this

Aborigines were also denied jobs because of their social class and ethnicity and also because people had a certain prejudice against Aborigines. This meant that Aborigines also had to endure economic inequality.
