Morrimura daims "I don't paint my artwork, I paint myself", as he poses in many appropriated works, replacing significant historical figures which are photographed.

The doccumentation is extremely important in Rrap's works as she aims to mimic precisely other artists subjects in a similar environment. For example, in the early 1900's during the impressionist movement, society did not value or appreciate radical movements therefore parr's shock value intentions would not have been accepted.
