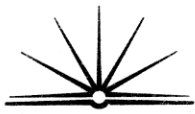


3 a i) "Haec Omnia" refers to ^{no discussion of} Catiline's plans for the attack on the state. That is, this meeting discussed who would stay in Rome & who would leave, what areas they would set fire to, & whom ~~what~~ would leave from where. (etc).

ii) This meeting occurred in the sickle maker's street at the house of Lepidus. Catiline's companions who were involved in his mad crimes were present.

iii) Cicero refers to the morning greeting of patrons by their dependents. This custom involves coming early to the patron's house, & greeting the patron, receiving an amount of money & then following the patron to where he is going to



offer support & assistance.

iv) Cicero is inviting Catiline to leave the city ("perge... proficiscero") rather than calling for his execution as Cicero does not have the full support of the senate. In addition Cicero recognises that by killing Catiline the plague of the state will continue to remain & another leader will come forward, however if Catiline leaves & takes with him his unscrupulous men the state will be relieved of the plague all together.
