b)i) Circero might expect "invidia" because Califine will be seen to have gone not as punishment, but as at the invitation of his friends, and being still alives, he would still be able to take action against the state. ii) In this extract Cicero portrays Catiline's character by reterring to his personal vices as well as the more public ones, a method used throughout the whole speech. Cicero uses a characteristic triple, Sed the net vitis huis int "pudor a surore " to highlight latiline's lack of those qualifies, "pudor", "rabio", metus", the which were valued by the Romans to make Catiline seen to be unlike the

Romans, not just opposed to them. This contrast between Catiline and the rest of the Romans makes contributes to the sense of Catiline's bringing deprairity which Cicero continuously refers to. theero also uses the word "inimico to make Cabiline a personal eveny. and to give ficero so "he salpe iam dixi
