(ii) The first line of this extract shows Aeneas' authority that he has taken on since realising his new responsibilities. The use of the imperative "cape" shows his understanding of what he has to do in order to protect his family. In lines 717-720 there is a strong use of personal pronouns, expressing how personal the responsibility really is, "to me me... Through the direct mention of latus shows the intimacy of the responsibility as well as making a clear indication of what he has to do.
